

ABOUT THE CIVIL SERVICES EXAMINATION

• The Civil Services Examination is conducted in 3 stages i.e. the Prelims, Main and the Personality Test. The entire process takes almost a year.

Stages of the Examination:

Stage I: The Preliminary Examination:

- The preliminary exam consists of two papers and the questions in the IAS Exam (Prelims) are of the objective type or Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs)
- There is 'Negative Marking' in the IAS Exam for each incorrect answer but only in the Prelims stage. The negative marking for incorrect answers will be 1/3rd (0.66) of the allotted marks of that question.
- The GS Paper II (CSAT) in IAS exam is of qualifying nature and candidates should score a minimum of 33 per cent in this paper to qualify to the next stage of the IAS exam i.e. the Mains.
- Blind candidates are given an extra time of 20 minutes for each paper in the IAS Exam (Prelims).
- It is mandatory for the candidates to appear in both the papers of civil services prelims exam for the evaluation.
- The marks scored by the candidates in the preliminary examination are not counted for the final score. It is only a screening test where candidates not securing the cut-off marks are eliminated.

Stage II: IAS Exam – UPSC Mains

The second stage of the IAS Exam is called the Mains Exam, which is a written descriptive examination and comprises 9 papers. The 9 papers in IAS Exam (Mains) are as follows: Paper-A (Compulsory Indian Language); Paper –B (English) which are qualifying in nature, while the other papers like Essay, General Studies Papers I, II, III, and IV, and Optional Papers I and II are considered for the final ranking.

Optional Subjects:

What is the Optional Subject in IAS exam?

For the civil services examination, UPSC provides a list of optional subjects. Candidates have to choose one optional for the mains exam. The optional subject has two papers and each paper accounts for 250 marks. Candidates can choose from the list of optional subjects that also includes literature subjects (English and Indian languages).

The papers for the examination will be descriptive in nature. Each paper for UPSC mains exam will be of three hours duration. The question papers, other than the literature of language papers will be set in Hindi and English only. The optional paper plays an important role in the UPSC mains exam.

Stage III: IAS Exam – UPSC Interview/Personality Test

Candidates who clear the Mains stage of the IAS exam with the required cut-off marks qualify for the final stage of the IAS exam i.e., the Personality Test or Interview round with the UPSC Board Members. The candidates who qualify to the final stage will be sent a summon by the Commission for a face-to-face discussion round with the board members. In this round, the board assesses the personality traits of the candidates and questions will be asked on their hobbies, current affairs, general knowledge, situational questions, etc. to evaluate if they are fit for a career in the civil services or not. The UPSC personality test will be held only at UPSC in New Delhi.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA (AGE LIMIT & EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION)

- The candidate must have at least a bachelor's degree from a recognised university to take the UPSC exam. Even those candidates who have written the final year exams of the qualifying exam (bachelor's degree) and are awaiting results can apply.
- Candidate must be a minimum of 21 years of age and must not be more than 32 years of age. General
 Category & EWS: 32 years; 6 attempts. OBC (with certificate): 32 years + 3 years; 9 attempts. SC/ST: 32 years
 + 5 years; unlimited attempts.



UPSC PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION SYLLABUS

The UPSC Prelims syllabus can be divided into two parts:

- 1. General Studies Paper I-Marks-200-Duration-2 hours
- 2. CSAT or General Studies Paper-II-Marks-200-Duration-2 hours

General Studies - PAPER I

The GSI paper in the IAS prelims comprises topics from History, Geography, Economy, polity and governance, general science, and most importantly current affairs.

Syllabus:

- Current events of national and international importance
- History of India and Indian National Movement
- Indian and World Geography Physical, Social, Economic Geography of India and the World
- Indian Polity and Governance Constitution, Political System, Panchayati Raj, Public Policy, Rights Issues, etc.
- Economic and Social Development Sustainable Development, Poverty, Inclusion, Demographics, Social Sector initiatives, etc.
- General issues on Environmental Ecology, Bio-diversity and Climate Change that do not require subject specialisation
- General Science

Civil Services Aptitude Test (CSAT) - PAPER II:

- Comprehension Interpersonal skills including communication skills;
- Logical reasoning and analytical ability Decision-making and problem solving General mental ability Basic numeracy (numbers and their relations, orders of magnitude, etc.) (Class X level),
- Data interpretation (charts, graphs, tables, data sufficiency etc. Class X level)

Notes:

- The CSAT aptitude test or Paper-II of the Civil Services (Preliminary) examination will be a qualifying paper only with a minimum of 33% to be secured.
- The questions in both Paper-I (General Studies) and Paper-II (Aptitude Test) will be of multiple choice or objective type.
- It is mandatory for the candidates to appear in both the papers of Civil Services (Prelim) examination for the purpose of evaluation. A candidate will be disqualified in case he or she does not appear in both the papers of the (Prelims) examination.
- The above syllabus was published by the Union Public Service Commission for the Civil Services Examination.



UPSC MAIN EXAMINATION SYLLABUS

Language Papers (Indian language and English)

Although both these papers are only qualifying in nature, candidates should not be complacent as if they fail to score below 25% in either of them; their remaining answer sheets won't even be evaluated. Both the papers follow a similar pattern of questions as given below.

- One essay question for 100 marks candidates have to select one out of a few given topics
- Reading comprehension and related five-six questions for a total of 60 marks
- Précis writing for 60 marks the answer sheet will have a separate grid structure where this has to be written
- Translation from English to chosen language for 20 marks
- Translation from chosen language to English for 20 marks
- Grammar and basic language usage such as synonyms, sentence correction etc. for a total of 40 marks

Essay

The UPSC mains syllabus does not have any prescribed syllabus for the essay paper as such. As per the UPSC, Candidates are expected to keep closely to the subject of the essay to arrange their ideas in an orderly fashion, and to write concisely. Credit will be given for effective and exact expression.

Candidates are required to write two essays from a list of given topics for a combined total of 250 marks.

- 2. Modern Indian history include the significant events, personalities, issues during the middle of the eighteenth century until the present

- 4. Post-independence consolidation and reorganization within the country
- 5. History of the world includes events, forms and effect on the society from 18th century like world wars, industrial revolution, colonization, redrawal of national boundaries, decolonization, political philosophies like communism, capitalism, socialism etc.
- 6. Salient aspects of Diversity of India and Indian Society
- 7. Role of women and women's organization, population and associated issues, poverty and developmental issues, urbanization, their problems and remedies
- 8. Social empowerment, communalism, regionalism & secularism



- 9. Distribution of key natural resources across the world including South Asia and the Indian subcontinent; factors responsible for the location of primary, secondary, and tertiary sector industries in various parts of the world including India
- 10. Effects of globalization on Indian society
- 11. Important Geophysical phenomena such as earthquakes, Tsunami, Volcanic activity, cyclone etc., geographical features and their location- changes in critical geographical features (including water-bodies and ice-caps) and in flora and fauna and the effects of such changes
- 12. Salient features of world's physical geography

General Studies - PAPER II

Governance, Constitution, Polity, Social Justice and International relations:

- 1. Indian Constitution-historical underpinnings, evolution, features, amendments, significant provisions and basic structure

General Studies - Paper IV

Ethics, Integrity and Aptitude:

This paper includes questions to check the candidate's' attitude and approach to issues relating to integrity, probity in public life and his/her problem solving approach to various issues and conflicts faced by him/her while dealing with society.

Questions may utilize the case study approach to determine these aspects and covers area:

- 1. Ethics and Human Interface- Essence, determinants and consequences of Ethics in human actions; dimensions of ethics; ethics in private and public relationships
- 2. Human Values- lessons from the lives and teachings of great leaders, reformers and administrators; role of family, society and educational institutions in inculcating values
- 3. Attitude- content, structure, function; its influence and relation with thought and behaviour; moral and political attitudes; social influence and persuasion
- 4. Aptitude and foundational values for Civil Service, integrity, impartiality and non-partisanship, objectivity, dedication to public service, empathy, tolerance and compassion towards the weaker-sections
- 5. Emotional intelligence-concepts, and their utilities and application in administration and governance
- 6. Contributions of moral thinkers and philosophers from India and world
- 7. Public/Civil service values and Ethics in Public administration- Status and problems; ethical concerns and dilemmas in government and private institutions; laws, rules, regulations and conscience as sources of ethical guidance; accountability and ethical governance; strengthening of ethical and moral values in governance; ethical issues in international relations and funding; corporate governance
- 8. Probity in Governance- Concept of public service; Philosophical basis of governance and probity; Information; sharing and transparency in government, Right to Information, Codes of Ethics, Codes of Conduct, Citizen's Charters, Work culture, Quality of service delivery, Utilization of public funds, challenges of corruption
- 9. Case Studies on above issues



UPSC Prelims Previous Year Paper Analysis (Subject Wise)

UPSC CSE Prelims Previous Year Papers Analysis helps assess the weightage and the type of questions being asked in the UPSC Exam. The analysis of the UPSC Previous Year Papers is an essential step in the UPSC preparation, as it helps in organizing the systematic efforts to maximize the output. Also, it helps to frame the right UPSC Preparation Strategy.

When the UPSC Prelims paper is analyzed subject-wise, it involves the breakdown of complex topics into simpler and smaller parts. Hence, an aspirant is exposed to the UPSC Exam Pattern and the areas he/she needs to emphasize more on. One can assess his/her strength and weakness in terms of exam preparedness by effective coverage of key concepts that are frequently asked. Through this, the aspirant can restrict his/her preparation according to the UPSC Syllabus and focus on the important aspects, without deviation.

For the UPSC Exam, it is essential to be aware of "What to read and what not to?" The analysis of the UPSC Previous Year Questions helps in doing so!


